ORDER NO. 77-96

WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS
FOR
COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE
TWIN PINES RANCH SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL SITE
Southeast of Banning - Riverside County

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Colorado River Basin Region, finds that:

1. The County of Riverside Probation Department (hereinafter also referred to as the discharger), P. O. Box 833, Riverside, CA 92502, submitted a Report of Waste Discharge dated October 27, 1975, and a supplemental report dated August 9, 1977.
2. The discharger proposes to discharge Groups 2 and 3 wastes (from facilities serving about 80 persons) in a 0.50 acre solid waste disposal site located in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 33, T3S, R2E, SBB&M, as shown in Attachment "A" incorporated herein and made a part of this Order. The disposal area is near the top of a small knoll, situated $\frac{1}{4}$ mile from Ditch Creek and Twin Pines Creek which are both intermittent streams. The site is to be operated as a trench landfill - the refuse is to be covered weekly.
3. The discharger reports that the solid waste consists primarily of paper and empty food containers. Food wastes are ground in a garbage disposal, and discharged into the ranch septic tank-leach field system.
4. This disposal site meets the criteria contained in the California Administrative Code, Title 23, Chapter 3, subchapter 15, for classification as a Class II-2 Disposal Site suitable to receive Group 2 and Group 3 wastes.
5. The Water Quality Control Plan for the West Colorado River Basin was adopted by the Board on April 10, 1975. The Basin Plan contains water quality objectives for the San Geronio Hydrologic Subunit.
6. The beneficial uses of the groundwaters of the San Geronio Hydrologic Subunit are:
 - a. Municipal supply
 - b. Industrial supply
 - c. Agricultural supply

7. Land within 1000 feet of this site is used as pasture for cattle.
8. The Board has notified the discharger and interested agencies and persons of its intent to revise waste discharge requirements for this discharge.
9. The Board in a public meeting heard and considered all comments pertaining to the discharge.
10. This solid waste disposal site constitutes an ongoing project in accordance with provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (Public Resources Code Section 21000 et seq.) and the State Guidelines because the governmental approvals on or after April 5, 1973, do not involve a greater degree of responsibility or control over such activity than the governmental approvals received prior to that date.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, the discharger shall comply with the following:


A. Discharge Specifications

1. Neither the treatment nor the discharge of waste shall create a pollution or a nuisance as defined in the California Water Code.
2. Waste materials shall not be discharged or allowed to be wind blown outside the designated disposal site shown on Attachment "A".
3. Adequate measures shall be taken to assure that flood or surface drainage waters do not erode or otherwise render portions of the disposal site inoperable.
4. Surface drainage from tributary areas, and internal site drainage from surface or subsurface sources shall not contact or percolate through waste other than Group 3 wastes discharged at this site.
5. Group 1 wastes shall not be discharged at this site.
6. Group 2 wastes shall not be discharged on any surface which is less than 10 feet above the highest anticipated ground-water level.
7. The discharger shall remove and relocate any wastes which are discharged at this site in violation of these requirements.

B. Provisions

1. The discharger shall construct flood protection facilities to comply with Discharge Specifications No. 3 and 4 by not later than February 10, 1978.
2. The discharger shall comply with the "Monitoring and Reporting Program No. 77-96", and the "General Provisions for Monitoring and Reporting", and future revisions thereto, as specified by the Executive Officer.
3. The discharger shall file with this Board a report of any material change or proposed change in the character, location or quantity of waste discharged. For the purpose of these requirements, this includes any proposed change in the boundaries or contours of the disposal site.
4. Ninety (90) days prior to discontinuing the use of this site for waste disposal, the discharger shall submit a technical report to the Board describing the methods and controls to be used to assure protection of the quality of surface and groundwaters of the area during final operations and with any proposed subsequent use of the land. This report shall be prepared by or under the supervision of a registered engineer or a certified engineering geologist. The method used to close the site and maintain protection of the quality of surface and groundwater shall comply with waste discharge requirements established by the Regional Board.
5. This Board considers the property owner to have a continuing responsibility for correcting any problems which may arise in the future as a result of this waste discharge or water applied to this property during subsequent use of the land for other purposes. In the event of any change in ownership of the disposal site, or change of operator, the County of Riverside Probation Department shall:
 - a. Notify this Board of such change; and
 - b. Notify the succeeding owner or operator of the existence of this Order by letter; a copy of which shall be filed with this Board.

Quarterly monitoring reports shall be submitted to the Regional Board by the 15th day of April, July, October and January of each year. Please forward monitoring reports to the following address:



SITE MAP


COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE

REQUIREMENTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS OF OTHER
GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

The State Department of Public Health recommends that the solid waste disposal site be operated in conformance with the health-related minimum standards for solid waste handling and disposal as set forth in Sections 17200 et seq., Title 14, California Administrative Code.
