

ORDER

APPLICATION 10041PERMIT 5736LICENSE 2916ORDER ALLOWING CORRECTION OF DESCRIPTION OF
PLACE OF USE

WHEREAS license was issued to Alvin S. McCollum and was filed with the County Recorder of Los Angeles County on March 26, 1948, and

WHEREAS license was subsequently assigned to Albert Read and Beatrice Read, and

WHEREAS licensees have established to the satisfaction of the State Water Rights Board that the correction of description of place of use under Application 10041, Permit 5736, License 2916, for which petition was submitted on August 26, 1960, will not operate to the injury of any other legal user of water and the Board so finds;

NOW THEREFORE IT IS ORDERED that permission be and the same is hereby granted to correct the description of the place of use under said Application 10041, Permit 5736, License 2916, to a place of use described as follows, to wit:

LOT 46 IN BIG TUJUNGA TRACT OF ANGELES NATIONAL FOREST, BEING WITHIN SE $\frac{1}{4}$ OF SE $\frac{1}{4}$ OF SECTION 3, T2N, R13W, SBB&M.

License for Diversion and Use of Water

THIS IS TO CERTIFY, That Alvin S. McCollum, Tujunga, California

Office of Assignment (Over)

has made proof as of April 18, 1945
(the date of inspection) to the satisfaction of the State Engineer of California of a right to the use of the waters of
La Paloma Canyon in Los Angeles County

tributary to Los Angeles River via Big Tujunga River

for the purpose of domestic use

under Permit 5736 of the Department of Public Works and that said right to the use of said waters has
been perfected in accordance with the laws of California, the rules and regulations of the Department of Public Works
and the terms of the said permit; that the priority of the right herein confirmed dates from October 17, 1940;

that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited
to the amount actually beneficially used for said purposes and shall not exceed two hundred (200) gallons
per day from January 1 to December 31 of each year.

This license is based on the use of water made during the year 1945 which
was the year of maximum use within the three year period immediately preceding
the date of inspection.

The point of diversion of such water is located North three hundred ninety five (395)
feet and West fifteen hundred (1500) feet from the Southeast corner of Section 3,
T 2 N., R 13 W., S.B.B. & M., being within the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 3.

A description of the lands or the place where such water is put to beneficial use is as follows:

Lot 72, Big Tujunga Tract, Angeles National Forest, located within the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$
of Section 3, T 2 N, R 13 W., S.B.B. & M.

The right under this license is of equal priority with the rights under Application
10027, Permit 5754, License 2773 and Application 10040, Permit 5735, License 2774.

All rights and privileges under this license including method of diversion, method of use and quantity of water
diverted are subject to the continuing authority of the Department acting through the State Engineer in accordance
with law and in the interest of the public welfare to prevent waste, unreasonable use, unreasonable method of use or
unreasonable method of diversion of said water.

Reports shall be filed promptly by licensee on appropriate forms which will be provided for the purpose from
time to time by the State Engineer.

The right to the diversion and use of the water aforesaid hereby confirmed is restricted to the point of diversion
herein specified and to the lands or place of use herein described.

This license is granted and licensee accepts all rights herein confirmed subject to the following provisions of the Water Code:

Section 1625. Each license shall be in such form and contain such terms as may be prescribed by the Department.

Section 1626. All licenses shall be under the terms and conditions of this division (of the Water Code).

Section 1627. A license shall be effective for such time as the water actually appropriated under it is used for a useful and beneficial purpose in conformity with this division (of the Water Code) but no longer.

Section 1628. Every license shall include the enumeration of conditions therein which in substance shall include all of the provisions of this article and the statement that any appropriator of water to whom a license is issued takes the license subject to the conditions therein expressed.

Section 1629. Every licensee, if he accepts a license, does so under the conditions precedent that no value whatsoever in excess of the actual amount paid to the State therefor shall at any time be assigned to or claimed for any license granted or issued under the provisions of this division (of the Water Code), or for any rights granted or acquired under the provisions of this division (of the Water Code), in respect to the regulation by any competent public authority of the services or the price of the services to be rendered by any licensee or by the holder of any rights granted or acquired under the provisions of this division (of the Water Code) or in respect to any valuation for purposes of sale to or purchase, whether through condemnation proceedings or otherwise, by the State or any city, city and county, municipal water district, irrigation district, lighting district, or any political subdivision of the State, of the rights and property of any licensee, or the possessor of any rights granted, issued, or acquired under the provisions of this division (of the Water Code).

Section 1630. At any time after the expiration of twenty years after the granting of a license, the State or any city, city and county, municipal water district, irrigation district, lighting district, or any political subdivision of the State shall have the right to purchase the works and property occupied and used under the license and the works built or constructed for the enjoyment of the rights granted under the license.

Section 1631. In the event that the State, or any city, city and county, municipal water district, irrigation district, lighting district, or political subdivision of the State so desiring to purchase and the owner of the works and property can not agree upon the purchase price, the price shall be determined in such manner as is now or may hereafter be provided by law for determining the value of property taken in eminent domain proceedings.
