ORDER REVOKING LICENSE

SOURCE: Unnamed Springs tributary to East Branch of North Fork Feather River

COUNTY: Plumas

WHEREAS:

1. A letter dated February 22, 2006 and a revocation request form dated April 5, 2006 have been received from the Licensees, requesting revocation of the above listed licenses by the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board), Division of Water Rights (Division).
2. The Division interprets the Licensee's request for revocation as a waiver of the notice and hearing requirements set forth in Water Code sections 1675 through 1675.2.

Therefore, it is ordered that Licenses 3355 and 3817 are hereby revoked by the State Water Board, and the water is declared to be subject to appropriation. This revocation may not result in additional water being available for new appropriations if there are applicable restrictions due to past State Water Board decisions regarding water availability.

License for Diversion and Use of Water

THIS IS TO CERTIFY, That Glenn R. Hubbell

Notice of Change (Over)

has made proof as of October 8, 1952
(the date of inspection) to the satisfaction of the State Engineer of California of a right to the use of the water of
an unnamed spring in Plumas County

tributary to an unnamed stream thence East Branch of North Fork Feather River

for the purpose of domestic use
under Permit 8210 of the Department of Public Works and that said right to the use of said water has
been perfected in accordance with the laws of California, the Rules and Regulations of the Department of Public Works
and the terms of the said permit; that the priority of the right herein confirmed dates from January 23, 1950;
and that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited
to the amount actually beneficially used for said purposes and shall not exceed seven hundred twenty (720)
gallons per day to be diverted from January 1 to December 31 of each year.

The point of diversion of such water is located north fifty-one degrees west (N51°W)
one hundred fifteen and five tenths (115.5) feet from S $\frac{1}{4}$ corner of Section 15,
T 25 N, R 8 E, MDB&M, being within SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 15.

A description of the lands or the place where such water is put to beneficial use is as follows:
within NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 22, T 25 N, R 8 E, MDB&M.

This license is granted and licensee accepts all rights herein confirmed subject to the following provisions of the Water Code:

Section 1625. Each license shall be in such form and contain such terms as may be prescribed by the Department.

Section 1626. All licenses shall be under the terms and conditions of this division (of the Water Code).

Section 1627. A license shall be effective for such time as the water actually appropriated under it is used for a useful and beneficial purpose in conformity with this division (of the Water Code) but no longer.

Section 1628. Every license shall include the enumeration of conditions therein which in substance shall include all of the provisions of this article and the statement that any appropriator of water to whom a license is issued takes the license subject to the conditions therein expressed.

Section 1629. Every licensee, if he accepts a license does so under the conditions precedent that no value whatsoever in excess of the actual amount paid to the State therefor shall at any time be assigned to or claimed for any license granted or issued under the provisions of this division (of the Water Code), or for any rights granted or acquired under the provisions of this division (of the Water Code), in respect to the regulation by any competent public authority of the services or the price of the services to be rendered by any licensee or by the holder of any rights granted or acquired under the provisions of this division (of the Water Code) or in respect to any valuation for purposes of sale or purchase, whether through condemnation proceedings or otherwise, by the State or any city, city and county, municipal water district, irrigation district, lighting district, or any political subdivision of the State, of the rights and property of any licensee, or the possessor of any rights granted, issued, or acquired under the provisions of this division (of the Water Code).

Section 1630. At any time after the expiration of twenty years after the granting of a license, the State or any city, city and county, municipal water district, irrigation district, lighting district, or any political subdivision of the State shall have the right to purchase the works and property occupied and used under the license and the works built or constructed for the enjoyment of the rights granted under the license.

Section 1631. In the event that the State, or any city, city and county, municipal water district, irrigation district, lighting district, or political subdivision of the State so desiring to purchase and the owner of the works and property can not agree upon the purchase price, the price shall be determined in such manner as is now or may hereafter be provided by law for determining the value of property taken in eminent domain proceedings.
