ORDER REVOKING LICENSE

SOURCE: Whiteys Creek tributary to Klamath River

COUNTY: Humboldt

WHEREAS:

1. A Report of Licensee dated May 14, 2004 has been received from the Licensee, requesting revocation of the license by the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB), Division of Water Rights (Division).
2. The Division interprets the Licensee's request for revocation as a waiver of the notice and hearing requirements set forth in Water Code sections 1675 through 1675.2.

Therefore, it is ordered that License 8387 is hereby revoked by the SWRCB, and the water is declared to be subject to appropriation. This revocation may not result in additional water being available for new appropriations if there are applicable restrictions due to past SWRCB decisions regarding water availability.

License for Diversion and Use of Water

LICENSE 8387

THIS IS TO CERTIFY, That

JAMES GALE HORN
P. O. BOX 247, ORLEANS, CALIFORNIA 95556 *over*

HAS made proof as of OCTOBER 20, 1967 (the date of inspection)
to the satisfaction of the State Water Resources Control Board of a right to the use of the water of
WHITIES CREEK (UNNAMED CREEK) IN HUMBOLDT COUNTY

tributary to KLAMATH RIVER

for the purpose of DOMESTIC USE
under Permit 13700 of the Board and that the right to the use of this water has been perfected in
accordance with the laws of California, the Regulations of the Board and the permit terms; that the priority of
this right dates from MARCH 16, 1962 and that the amount of water to which this right is
entitled and hereby confirmed is limited to the amount actually beneficially used for the stated purposes and shall
not exceed ONE THOUSAND (1000) GALLONS PER DAY TO BE DIVERTED FROM JANUARY 1 TO
DECEMBER 31 OF EACH YEAR.

THE POINT OF DIVERSION OF SUCH WATER IS LOCATED:

SOUTH 1,950 FEET AND EAST 2,000 FEET FROM W1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 6, T10N, R6E, HB&M,
BEING WITHIN SE1/4 OF SW1/4 OF SAID SECTION 6.

A DESCRIPTION OF LANDS OR THE PLACE WHERE
SUCH WATER IS PUT TO BENEFICIAL USE IS AS FOLLOWS:

WITHIN NE1/4 OF SW1/4 OF SECTION 6, T10N, R6E, HB&M.

Licensee shall allow representatives of the Board and other parties, as may be authorized from time to time by the Board, reasonable access to project works to determine compliance with the terms of this license.

All rights and privileges under this license including method of diversion, method of use and quantity of water diverted are subject to the continuing authority of the Board in accordance with law and in the interest of the public welfare to prevent waste, unreasonable use, unreasonable method of use or unreasonable method of diversion of said water.

Reports shall be filed promptly by licensee on appropriate forms which will be provided for the purpose from time to time by the Board.

The right hereby confirmed to the diversion and use of water is restricted to the point or points of diversion herein specified and to the lands or place of use herein described.

This license is granted and licensee accepts all rights herein confirmed subject to the following provisions of the Water Code:

Section 1625. Each license shall be in such form and contain such terms as may be prescribed by the Board.

Section 1626. All licenses shall be under the terms and conditions of this division (of the Water Code).

Section 1627. A license shall be effective for such time as the water actually appropriated under it is used for a useful and beneficial purpose in conformity with this division (of the Water Code) but no longer.

Section 1628. Every license shall include the enumeration of conditions therein which in substance shall include all of the provisions of this article and the statement that any appropriator of water to whom a license is issued takes the license subject to the conditions therein expressed.

Section 1629. Every licensee, if he accepts a license does so under the conditions precedent that no value whatsoever in excess of the actual amount paid to the State therefor shall at any time be assigned to or claimed for any license granted or issued under the provisions of this division (of the Water Code), or for any rights granted or acquired under the provisions of this division (of the Water Code), in respect to the regulation by any competent public authority of the services or the price of the services to be rendered by any licensee or by the holder of any rights granted or acquired under the provisions of this division (of the Water Code) or in respect to any valuation for purposes of sale to or purchase, whether through condemnation proceedings or otherwise, by the State or any city, city and county, municipal water district, irrigation district, lighting district, or any political subdivision of the State, of the rights and property of any licensee, or the possessor of any rights granted, issued, or acquired under the provisions of this division (of the Water Code).

Section 1630. At any time after the expiration of twenty years after the granting of a license, the State or any city, city and county, municipal water district, irrigation district, lighting district, or any political subdivision of the State shall have the right to purchase the works and property occupied and used under the license and the works built or constructed for the enjoyment of the rights granted under the license.

Section 1631. In the event that the State, or any city, city and county, municipal water district, irrigation district, lighting district, or political subdivision of the State so desiring to purchase and the owner of the works and property cannot agree upon the purchase price, the price shall be determined in such manner as is now or may hereafter be provided by law for determining the value of property taken in eminent domain proceedings.

ORDER ALLOWING CHANGE IN POINT OF DIVERSION

WHEREAS License 8387 was issued to James Gale Horn and was recorded with the County Recorder of Humboldt County on February 13, 1968, (at page 466, Volume 950, of the official records), and

WHEREAS the State Water Resources Control Board has found that the change in point of diversion under said license for which petition was submitted on May 14, 1970, will not operate to the injury of any other legal user of water, and

WHEREAS the Board has approved and allowed said change and has directed that an order be issued to describe said point of diversion in accordance with said petition;

NOW THEREFORE IT IS ORDERED that permission be and the same is hereby granted to change the point of diversion under said License 8387 to points of diversion described as follows, to wit:

1. SOUTH 1,950 FEET AND EAST 2,000 FEET FROM $W\frac{1}{4}$ CORNER OF SECTION 6, T10N, R6E, HB&M, BEING WITHIN $SE\frac{1}{4}$ OF $SW\frac{1}{4}$ OF SAID SECTION 6.
2. SOUTH 3,366 FEET AND EAST 3,267 FEET FROM $W\frac{1}{4}$ CORNER OF SECTION 6, T10N, R6E, HB&M, BEING WITHIN $NW\frac{1}{4}$ OF $NE\frac{1}{4}$ OF SECTION 7, T10N, R6E, HB&M.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that License 8387 be amended as follows, to wit:
