Application 17605, Permit 11224

**ORDER APPROVING A NEW DEVELOPMENT SCHEDULE
AND AMENDING THE PERMIT**

WHEREAS:

1. Permit 11224 was issued to Jackson Valley Irrigation District on February 28, 1958 pursuant to Application 17605.
2. A petition for an extension of time within which to develop the project and apply the water to the proposed use was filed with the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) on December 15, 1999.
3. The permittee has proceeded with diligence and good cause has been shown for extension of time. Public notice of the request for extension of time was issued on March 17, 2000 and no protests were received.
4. The SWRCB has determined that the petition for extension of time does not constitute the initiation of a new right nor operate to the injury of any other lawful user of water.
5. Fish, wildlife, and plant species have been or may be listed under the federal Endangered Species Act and/or the California Endangered Species Act. A term should be placed in the permit making the permittee aware of possible obligations resulting from these acts.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED THAT:


1. Condition 5 of the permit be amended to read:

Complete application of the water to the authorized use shall be made by
December 31, 2010.

2. An endangered Species term shall be added to read as follows:

This permit does not authorize any act which results in the taking of a threatened or endangered species or any act which is now prohibited, or becomes prohibited in the future, under either the California Endangered Species Act (Fish and Game Code sections 2050 to 2097) or the federal Endangered Species Act (16 U.S.C.A. sections 1531 to 1544). If a "take" will result from any act authorized under this water right, the permittee shall obtain authorization for an incidental take prior to construction or operation of the project. Permittee shall be responsible for meeting all requirements of the applicable Endangered Species Act for the project authorized under this permit. (0000014)

WHEREAS:

1. Permit 11224 was issued to Jackson Valley Irrigation District on February 28, 1958 pursuant to Application 17605.
2. A petition for an extension of time within which to develop the project and apply the water to the proposed use has been filed with the State Water Resources Control Board (Board).
3. The permittee has proceeded with diligence and good cause has been shown for said extension of time.
4. Permit Condition 7 pertaining to the continuing authority of the Board should be updated to conform to Section 780(a), Title 23 of the California Code of Regulations.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED THAT:

1. Condition 5 of the permit be amended to read:

COMPLETE APPLICATION OF THE
WATER TO THE PROPOSED USE
SHALL BE MADE ON OR BEFORE

December 31, 1999

2. Condition 7 of the permit be amended to read:

Pursuant to California Water Code Sections 100 and 275, and the common law public trust doctrine, all rights and privileges under this permit and under any license issued pursuant thereto, including method of diversion, method of use, and quantity of water diverted, are subject to the continuing authority of the State Water Resources Control Board in accordance with law and in the interest of the public welfare to protect public trust uses and to prevent waste, unreasonable use, unreasonable method of use, or unreasonable method of diversion of said water.

The continuing authority of the Board may be exercised by imposing specific requirements over and above those contained in this permit with a view to eliminating waste of water and to meeting the reasonable water requirements of permittee without unreasonable draft on the source. Permittee may be required to implement a water conservation plan, features of which may include but not necessarily be limited to: (1) reusing or reclaiming the water allocated; (2) using water reclaimed by another entity instead of all or part of the water allocated; (3) restricting diversions so as to eliminate agricultural tailwater or to reduce return flow; (4) suppressing evaporation losses from water surfaces;

(5) controlling phreatophytic growth; and (6) installing, maintaining, and operating efficient water measuring devices to assure compliance with the quantity limitations of this permit and to determine accurately water use as against reasonable water requirements for the authorized project. No action will be taken pursuant to this paragraph unless the Board determines, after notice to affected parties and opportunity for hearing, that such specific requirements are physically and financially feasible and are appropriate to the particular situation.

The continuing authority of the Board also may be exercised by imposing further limitations on the diversion and use of water by the permittee in order to protect public trust uses. No action will be taken pursuant to this paragraph unless the Board determines, after notice to affected parties and opportunity for hearing, that such action is consistent with California Constitution Article X, Section 2; is consistent with the public interest and is necessary to preserve or restore the uses protected by the public trust. No action will be taken pursuant to this paragraph unless the Board determines, after notice to affected parties and opportunity for hearing, that such specific requirements are physically and financially feasible and are appropriate to the particular situation. PLACE OF USE AND AMENDING THE PERMIT

WHEREAS:

1. A petition to change the purposes of use and place of use has been filed with the State Water Resources Control Board.
2. The permittee has proceeded with diligence and good cause has been shown the said changes.
3. The Board has determined that the petitioned changes do not constitute the initiation of a new right nor operate to the injury of any other lawful user of water.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED THAT:

1. The purposes of use under this permit shall be as follows:

Irrigation, domestic, recreational, wildlife propagation, fish culture and incidental power

2. The place of use under this permit shall be as follows:

8,000 acres net within a gross area of 12,800 acres within Jackson Valley Irrigation District, being within T5N, R9E and R10E, MDB&M, and reservoir area within Sections 3, 4, 9, 10, 15 and 16, T5N, R10E, MDB&M, as shown on map filed with the State Water Resources Control Board. At powerhouse located within SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 9, T5N, R10E, MDB&M.

3. Paragraph 9 is added to this permit as follows:

The quantity of water diverted under this permit and under any license issued pursuant thereto is subject to modification by the State Water Resources Control Board if, after notice to the permittee and an opportunity for hearing, the Board finds that such modification is necessary to meet water quality objectives in water quality control plans which have been or hereafter may be established or modified pursuant to Division 7 of the Water Code. No action will be taken pursuant to this paragraph unless the Board finds that (1) adequate waste discharge requirements have been prescribed and are in effect with respect to all waste discharges which have any substantial effect upon water quality in the area involved, and (2) the water quality objectives cannot be achieved solely through the control of waste discharges.



This is to certify that the application of which the foregoing is a true and correct copy has been considered and approved by the State Water Rights Board SUBJECT TO VESTED RIGHTS and the following limitations and conditions:

1. The amount of water appropriated shall be limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, and shall not exceed fifty (50) cubic feet per second to be diverted from about March 1 to about May 31 of each year and thirty thousand (30,000) acre-feet per annum to be collected from about November 1 of each year to about May 31 of the succeeding year; all as more explicitly set forth in Paragraph 2 of this approved application. (000005)

The equivalent of such continuous flow allowance for any thirty day period may be diverted in a shorter time if there be no interference with vested rights.

2. The maximum amount herein stated may be reduced in the license if investigation so warrants. (00 00006)

3. Actual construction work shall begin on or before June 1, 1958, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence, and if not so commenced and prosecuted this permit may be revoked. (000000)

4. Said construction work shall be completed on or before April 1, 1963. (0000008)

5. Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before September 1, 1965. (0000009)

6. Progress reports shall be filed promptly by permittee on forms which will be provided annually by the State Water Rights Board until license is issued. (0000010)

7. All rights and privileges under this permit including method of diversion, method of use and quantity of water diverted are subject to the continuing authority of the State Water Rights Board in accordance with law and in the interest of the public welfare to prevent waste, unreasonable use, unreasonable method of use or unreasonable method of diversion of said water.

8. A separate application for approval of plans and specifications for construction of the dam shall be filed with and approved by the Department of Water Resources, prior to commencement of construction of the dam described under this approved water right application. (0360048)

This permit is issued and permittee takes it subject to the following provisions of the Water Code:

Section 1390. A permit shall be effective for such time as the water actually appropriated under it is used for a useful and beneficial purpose in conformity with this division (of the Water Code), but no longer.

Section 1391. Every permit shall include the enumeration of conditions therein which in substance shall include all of the provisions of this article and the statement that any appropriator of water to whom a permit is issued takes it subject to the conditions therein expressed.

Section 1392. Every permittee, if he accepts a permit, does so under the conditions precedent that no value whatsoever in excess of the actual amount paid to the State therefor shall at any time be assigned to or claimed for any permit granted or issued under the provisions of this division (of the Water Code), or for any rights granted or acquired under the provisions of this division (of the Water Code), in respect to the regulation by any competent public authority of the services or the price of the services to be rendered by any permittee or by the holder of any rights granted or acquired under the provisions of this division (of the Water Code) or in respect to any valuation for purposes of sale to or purchase, whether through condemnation proceedings or otherwise, by the State or any city, city and county, municipal water district, irrigation district, lighting district, or any political subdivision of the State, of the rights and property of any permittee, or the possessor of any rights granted, issued, or acquired under the provisions of this division (of the Water Code).


