PERMIT FOR DIVERSION AND USE OF WATER

PERMIT 20765

Application 30061 of Deetjen's Inc., A California Corporation,

Highway 1, Big Sur, CA 93920

filed on February 7, 1992, has been approved by the State Water Resources Control Board
 SUBJECT TO PRIOR RIGHTS and to the limitations and conditions of this permit.

Permittee is hereby authorized to divert and use water as follows:

The place of use is shown on map on file with the State Water Resources Control Board.

5. The water appropriated shall be limited to the quantity which can be beneficially used and shall not exceed 7525 gallons per day by direct diversion from January 1 to December 31 of each year for domestic purposes and 7500 gallons per day by direct diversion from January 1 to December 31 of each year for irrigation purposes. The maximum amount diverted under this permit for all uses shall not exceed 15.3 acre-feet per year. (0000005)
6. The amount authorized for appropriation may be reduced in the license if investigation warrants. (0000006)
7. Complete application of the water to the authorized use shall be made by December 31, 1998. (0000009)
8. Progress reports shall be submitted promptly by permittee when requested by the State Water Resources Control Board until a license is issued. (0000010)
9. Permittee shall allow representatives of the State Water Resources Control Board and other parties, as may be authorized from time to time by said Board, reasonable access to project works to determine compliance with the terms of this permit. (0000011)
10. Pursuant to California Water Code Sections 100 and 275, and the common law public trust doctrine, all rights and privileges under this permit and under any license issued pursuant thereto, including method of diversion, method of use, and quantity of water diverted, are subject to the continuing authority of the State Water Resources Control Board in accordance with law and in the interest of the public welfare to protect public trust uses and to prevent waste, unreasonable use, unreasonable method of use or unreasonable method of diversion of said water.

The continuing authority of the Board may be exercised by imposing specific requirements over and above those contained in this permit with a view to eliminating waste of water and to meeting the reasonable water requirements of permittee without unreasonable draft on the source. Permittee may be required to implement a water conservation plan, features of which may include but not necessarily be limited to: (1) reusing or reclaiming the water allocated; (2) using water reclaimed by another entity instead of all or part of the water allocated; (3) restricting diversions so as to eliminate agricultural tailwater or to reduce return flow; (4) suppressing evaporation losses from water surfaces; (5) controlling phreatophytic growth; and (6) installing, maintaining, and operating efficient water measuring devices to assure compliance with the quantity limitations of this permit and to determine accurately water use as against reasonable water requirements for the authorized project. No action will be taken pursuant to this paragraph unless the Board determines, after notice to affected parties and opportunity for hearing, that such specific requirements are physically and financially feasible and are appropriate to the particular situation.

The continuing authority of the Board also may be exercised by imposing further limitations on the diversion and use of water by the permittee in order to protect public trust uses. No action will be taken pursuant to this paragraph unless the Board determines, after notice to affected parties and opportunity for hearing, that such action is consistent with California Constitution Article X, Section 2; is consistent with the public interest and is necessary to preserve or restore the uses protected by the public trust. 11. The quantity of water diverted under this permit and under any license issued pursuant thereto is subject to modification by the state Water Resources Control Board if, after notice to the permittee and an opportunity for hearing, the Board finds that such modification is necessary to meet water quality objectives in water quality control plans which have been or hereafter may be established or modified pursuant to Division 7 of the Water Code. No action will be taken pursuant to this paragraph unless the Board finds that (1)adequate waste discharge requirements have been prescribed and are in effect with respect to all waste discharges which have any substantial effect upon water quality in the area involved, and (2)the water quality objectives cannot be achieved solely through the control of waste discharges. 12. This permit shall not be construed as conferring upon permittee right of access to the point of diversion. (000022)

13. Permittee shall comply with the following provisions which are derived from the agreement between permittee and Packard Ranch, David Packard Trustee (Packard), executed on January 4, 1994, and filed with the County Recorder of the County of Monterey under Number 01572 on January 6, 1994, and with the State Water Resources Control Board:

- (a) Deetjen's Inc. rights pursuant to this permit (A30061) and pursuant to any permit acquired hereafter shall be junior to prior vested rights of Packard Ranch except rights to other water from Castro Canyon (Creek) for strictly residential purposes on the 3.95 acre portion of the Deetjen's Property as described in and subject to the terms of the Decree Quieting Title and Fixing Ownership in Rights of Water in Castro Creek.

(b) Based on the various stages of stream flow at the catch basin in Castro Canyon (Creek) located approximately 1,040 feet from the State Highway right of way (Packard point of diversion), diversion under this permit shall be as follows:

- 15,000 gallons per day (gpd) if stream flow is more than 100 gallons per minute (gpm)
- 10,000 gpd if stream flow is from 75 to 100 gpm;
- 7,500 gpd if stream flow is from 60 to 75 gpm;
- 5,000 gpd if stream flow is from 35 to 60 gpm; and
- At Packard's discretion, limited to amount required for fire protection and basic human needs (i.e. drinking and hygiene) if the stream flow is less than 35 gpm.

(c) Permittee shall install and maintain devices satisfactory to the State Water Resources Control Board to measure the rate and quantity of water diverted from Castro Canyon (Creek). Said measuring devices shall be properly installed and maintained by the permittee.

Inclusion in this permit of certain provisions of the referenced agreement shall not be construed as disapproval of other provisions of the agreement or as affecting the enforceability, as between the parties, of such other provisions insofar as they are not inconsistent with the terms of this permit. 14. For the protection of fish and wildlife, permittee shall bypass sufficient water to maintain continuous visible surface flow to the Pacific Ocean. (0140060)

This permit is issued and permittee takes it subject to the following provisions of the Water Code:

Section 1390. A permit shall be effective for such time as the water actually appropriated under it is used for a useful and beneficial purpose in conformity with this division (of the Water Code), but no longer.

Section 1391. Every permit shall include the enumeration of conditions therein which in substance shall include all of the provisions of this article and the statement that any appropriator of water to whom a permit is issued takes it subject to the conditions therein expressed.

Section 1392. Every permittee, if he accepts a permit, does so under the conditions precedent that no value whatsoever in excess of the actual amount paid to the State therefor shall at any time be assigned to or claimed for any permit granted or issued under the provisions of this division (of the Water Code), or for any rights granted or acquired under the provisions of this division (of the Water Code), in respect to the regulation by any competent public authority of the services or the price of the services to be rendered by any permittee or by the holder of any rights granted or acquired under the provisions of this division (of the Water Code) or in respect to any valuation for purposes of sale to or purchase, whether through condemnation proceedings or otherwise, by the State or any city, city and county, municipal water district, irrigation district, lighting district, or any political subdivision of the State, of the rights and property of any permittee, or the possessor of any rights granted, issued, or acquired under the provisions of this division (of the Water Code).
